Weight ~ The Reality Series Curricula (2017)

This 22-lesson set consists of two series: Becoming Weight Wise and Becoming Body Wise. The first series of 11 lessons was introduced in 2005. The second series was introduced in 2008. Thanks to colleagues in Agricultural Communications and Family and Consumer Sciences Extension, the entire curricula set has been edited, designed, and posted on an internal web page accessible by County Extension Agents for Family and Consumer Sciences. Each lesson includes a leader's guide, presentations, recipes, activities, participant monitoring forms, and program evaluation and reporting tools.

- DHN 603 Advanced Community Program Development, Fall 2005- present

This course focuses on concepts and theories of program development, use of planned goals and objectives, use of data from national monitoring, survey and surveillance programs, and community assessment to guide decision making for program development. Program planning, social marketing, and formative, process, and outcome evaluation are examined and applied to community program development. We learn much from each other. Every student is encouraged to be an engaged participant. The course employs a variety of teaching strategies; we use experience, active learning, and reflection to enhance the learning process.

• **DHN 605 Food Systems and Society**, Fall 2015-2018

This course follows food from farm to table, including growing, harvesting, processing, packaging, transporting, marketing, consumption, and disposal. Policy and culture determine who eats what and who

benefits and loses in any given food system. As result, food systems vary considerably across the world with each evolving to affect overall health. The course will assess sustainability of food systems and explore the ethical, economical, socio-ecological, and environmental factors that affect local, regional, national, and global food system development. Content includes case study evaluations and current research in the field.
